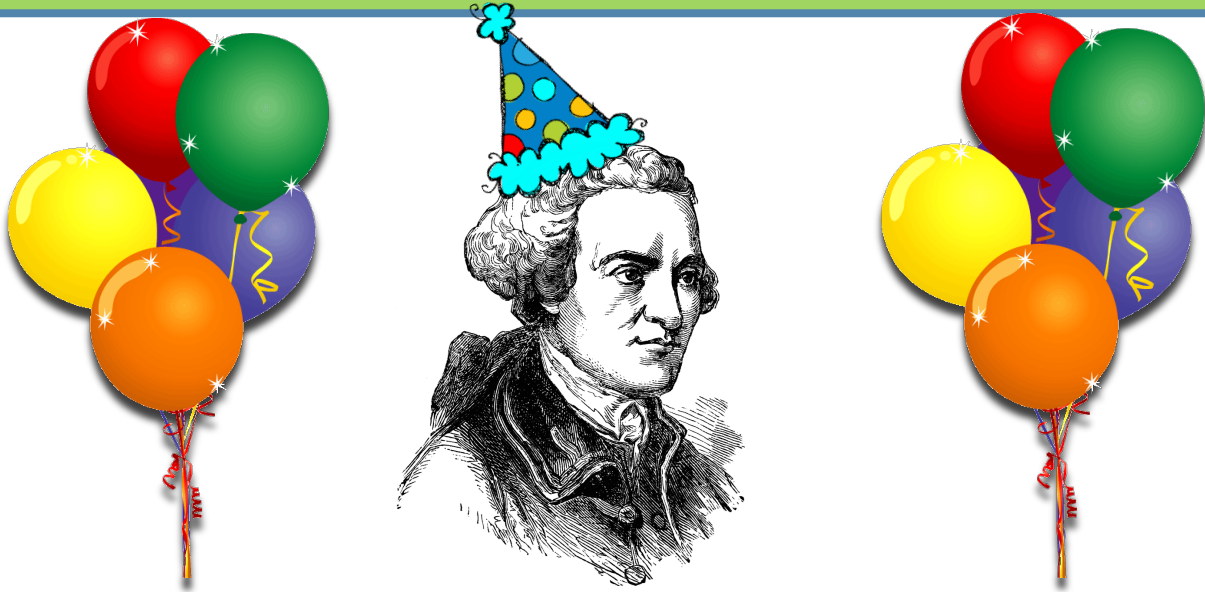

John Hancock



John Hancock (January 12, 1737 – October 8, 1793) was President of the Second Continental Congress and of the Congress of the Confederation, first Governor of Massachusetts, and the first person to sign the United States Declaration of Independence.

John Hancock's signature is the most prominent on the United States Declaration of Independence.
