

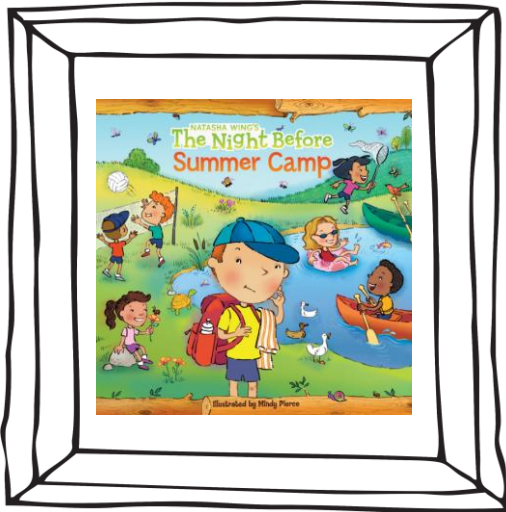

BOOK: The Night Before Summer Camp

Speech & Language Targets:

- **Narration:** In this story, Rick is nervous about attending summer camp. Have your child retell a story to you about a time that they were nervous. Did you hear your child use appropriate past tense verb endings? Did their story have a clear beginning, middle, and end?
- **Articulation:** See accompanying activity on the next page: Speech Canoes! Your child will get in 100 trials of their articulation target/s!
- **Plurals:** There are many opportunities to practice words with plural -s ending in this story. Have your child point to all the words on each page that have a plural -s ending. Then, have them practice each word in a new sentence.
- **Sequencing:** In this story, the children at camp make boats. Have your child practice their sequencing skills by telling you the steps to make a boat, starting with the first step of gathering wood. If your child needs more support in this area, write down the steps or draw pictures of the steps and have your child rearrange them into correct sequential order.
- **Complex Sentences:** Have your child practice writing complex sentences about a summer camp of their dreams. They can use the conjunctions 'because, if, but'...etc. For example: "My summer camp will have art day, because I love to paint."
